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Currently there is no money but will talk with chapter manager. Maybe there's still some money left somewhere, we'll let you know before June 7th. Motion by Mary Benally to defer to administration, second by Alice White, with a vote of 28 in favor, 0 opposed, 4 abstained, motion carried.

David John – restate the motion for item with addition of c, d, e, It should not be a conflict of interest as a leader for the community, it is an individual's job to take care of any concerns/issues.

Another motion to table it by Betty Slim second by Pauline Black with a vote of 29 in favor, 0 opposed, 5 abstained, motion carried.

Jerry Tsosie – request to NDOT to just transfer the budget to the chapters so we can do our own road, we have a grader here, maybe that way we can maintain our own road.

Woody Lee – our own road maintenance people (will maintain 15 miles of bus route) do it twice a year. We are saying to be self sufficient, we have a grader and give us the money allocated for you guys, and we can do our own road.

Richard Yanito – 15 miles? There are a lot of roads, don't want to affect the Utah road, thinks those roads in Utah are being maintained often.

Lucy White – is it per # of roads listed -15 miles.

Tolin Hatalie – There are a lot of bus routes and emergency vehicle that use these routes so why just 15 miles.

David John – Recognizes a visitor from Sanostee Chapter CLUP member and health board representative is here with us. A lot of you are questioning it so maybe we can **table** it until next month. Needs a lot of discussion, the way we do it is there is a motion already, just make another motion to table it and second it (above)

G. A.MWCMA Y05-086 A RESOLUTION PROVIDING THE POSITION OF THE _____ CHAPTER TO SUPPORT AND APPROVE THE TRANSFER OF THE NAVAJO TRUST FUND THE UTAH DINEH CORPORATION AS PER HCR 11 AND SIGN BY GOVERNOR HERBERT OF UTAH ON APRIL 1, 2013

Went under New Business item A. Motion by Mary Benally, second by Pauline Black with a vote of 25 in favor, 0 opposed, 2 abstained, motion carried. There are 32 of you sitting in here, five of you did not vote so understand that.

Esther Reddoore – would like Kenneth Maryboy to explain/clarify it again for the Utah people.

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Kenneth Maryboy, HCR 11, is now at Utah State, when it first became an issue, trying to name a few who would be the trustee (UNHS, UNDC), etc. But Congress did not want any of these corporations and the only corporation that came forward was **Utah Dineh Corporation**, there were board members, by-laws, article of incorporation, etc.

Now the revised policy is here and there is a resolution back in 2008 stating that maybe we could do it this way/that way, everybody had their own ideas, but it did not happen. At Washington when Senator Bennett, options were open, he was requesting for a plan, nobody had a plan for that reason last year, Utah Governor met with Ben Shelly. All chapters were invited, they had a meeting, and President Ben Shelly was told that comes 2013 "I'm taking a position by". Town Hall meetings were done and President Ben Shelly was question on the statement he made,

"I am taking a marching order from Utah Navajo" it's been five years since then and what's your plan? There was no plan from President Shelly. Anybody have a plan? Nothing. Coming of 2013 I'm taking a position, that position is "I'm keeping the money in Utah". If I'm keeping the money in Utah, then I have a position. There is only one plan so far, which is "**Utah Dineh Corporation**". All these resolutions that were voted on are over here now. Governor stated that he was dealing directly with US Senate in Congress. So the Governor took a position.

Then there are Utah State House of Representative Mike Newell, **HCR 11** house bill and passed it unanimously then went to David Heinekens Senator of Utah, went through Utah State Senate, it went back to the House of Representative for final reading, when this was done then the governor gave it 20 days and he signed off on it in support of **Utah Dineh Corporation**, doing a curtesy call to Utah Navajo by coming down to visit with us on **May 29, 2013**. Need at least 5 resolution and will do a strike out with Senator Orin Hatch and some Congressmen, will be carrying these five resolutions to Washington, I will sit with Senator because I already took a position I sign off on it where it says Utah/Navajo Nation, strike those out and insert **Utah Dineh Corporation** as the next trustee. There was no other options because there is already a law suit, he can't wait. NN still wants it and people think there should be another options. Meanwhile the governor is sitting on edge due to another law suit has been filed. Because of this the governor doesn't want it back, I don't want to touch that money and wants to give it to somebody else, but it's not going to be NN. The only thing we have is **Utah Dineh Corporation**, cannot wait any longer, due to this reason the governor wants these 5 resolutions and the governor will be traveling to Washington and will be here on **May 28-30, 2013** visiting with the Chapters.

Right now Teec Nos Pos has tabled this due to K'aayalii has a different idea. If it gets table it's not going to look good on Utah Navajo because the Governor is going to be here in May and if that happens we're going to look like fools. The governor will say – "The only options that I stated and standing with, you did not support it". Teec Nos Pos chapter meeting is going to take place until after the visit of the Governor. Navajo Mountain and Oljeto passed their resolution. Red Mesa is still at Public Hearing. We need to pass this HCR 11 supporting resolution so that way the transferring will be done and we need the money to come back to us. Furthermore there are so many people asking for housing for their youth, etc. This is probably about the most important time for the Utah people. At least do 4 resolutions to take back with him.

There are 3 options: Governor has written, given to chapters

1. What Utah has done with the trust fund options
2. Utah Dineh Corporation's options
3. Navajo Nation; pros/cons, (oil production percentage, overhead cost, same with Utah Dineh Corporation. The governor will cover all this, right now it's like this and will be like this, etc. "Thanks for the resolution and will be working together further".

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The only option, if we don't want the Utah Dineh Corporation, you know that Utah State don't want to touch the Trust Fund anymore, so the only option he would be left would be to give the money to Navajo Nation. Those are what we face with. We were talking about Land Use Plan, we have dreams in Utah, the only reason we have dream is because we have water settlement, we have economic development, what does it need? Water/money. All this coincides together. What I am doing and trying to do but you don't understand: Scenario: "Trying to push a horse to water and does not want the water". It's like that and feels that way. Do you know why I feel this way?

There is a group of people living within Aneth Extension 1933 Act open the money for only those who were living in Aneth Extension. Council, who had heart 1968 they introduce legislation, uses the money up to Navajo Mountain area, for that reason we use the money the way we want it. If we don't get this money, there will not be any money for us Utah, only very few people are going to benefit from it. *The problem is Kenneth/Mark Maryboy doing it for themselves! Articles of Incorporation has nothing to do with the Maryboys, in there, anywhere, you will not find Maryboys, it's not a Maryboy Corporation, it's Utah Dineh Corporation. Another reason people are saying is Mark/Kenneth Maryboy becoming CEO and running around for It "I don't have any intention to continue to deal with this, as soon as this is approved, I got some other dreams that I would like to do". Go ahead now and do what has been approved is what I want to say but people are accusing/giving me negativness. Because of this reason people are having second thoughts "Kenneth wants the money for himself".*

If you want it, approve it, if you don't believe me or still having a difficulty understanding it, go back to 1933 and support that resolution, either do that or support this resolution.

Mary Benally – there is a committee/board; we need money for college students, housing, etc. Mark Maryboy has helped with all and he has his own business. Board members, Willie Grayeyes, 2 ladies from Oljeto, Mexican Water: Mary Benally/Meridith Benally, Victor Dee from Red Mesa, Leonard Lee from Aneth, have a big/hugh understanding of the issue at home. Self determination has been stress over and over, welfare has put a mark on us, and so we need to take care/control the money at hand.

Kenneth Maryboy – it's going to benefit you, it's for you, Utah people. Thank the people who voted on, it is difficult if you don't understand something, etc. He is planning to go to Washington. Navajo Mountain and Mexican Water are in support/pass it right now. Teec Nos Pos, not enough people from Utah and it got tabled, which is going to be too bad, because the Governor is going to be here and their Chapter meeting is not until next month again. Aneth does not support this. Try to support Red Mesa Chapter and they got it off the Agenda too.

H. MWCMA05-087 Approve to request Navajo Utah Commission to rescind NUC Resolution and to replenish the San Juan County Recreation funds back to the Utah Chapters, Funds were not authorized to be used towards the Utah Navajo Fair.

Motion to approve to request by Cassandra Beletso, second by Sarah Yanito with a vote of 28 in favor, 0 opposed, 4 abstained, motion carried.

Recreation fund is to help those who are requesting a certain amount of fund such as activities in the local area and request from schools.

I. MWCMA05-088 requesting a resolution to economic development in Window Rock to expedite cleanup of underground storage tank for Tes Nez Iah Store and refer to Mexican Water after clean up.

Motion to request a resolution by Tolin Hatalie, second by Harry W. Tsosie with a vote of 28 in favor, 0 opposed, 4 abstained, motion carried.

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David John – NN needs to fix it first, it probably will cost about \$150,000 to fix it and we don't have that kind of money, let them fix it first and then give it back to us, if it stays the way it is now and we take it back, we will be liable for it.

J. Directing Speakers Office and the oversight Committee to re-evaluate UTNC

Motion to re-evaluate UTNC by Sarah Yanito, second by Betty Slim with a vote of 27 in favor, 0 opposed, 4 abstained, motion carried.

According to Kenneth he believe they don't need to exist, they work under the Speaker, oversight committee and nabik'iya'ti' and let them re-evaluate.

Kenneth Maryboy – Officials and naha'a'i is going well, 110 Council to 88 and at that time the council was separate mainly because there were Black Mesa Review Board and Navajo Hopi Commission did exist. How can we have that in Utah, the council from Utah were selected at that time when it was being put together, Dennehotso was allowed to be on the Utah commission. At that time only the Council were in existence, NN Tribal Code, Title 2 is Utah commission and Title 26 is the chapters. The local stores, homes, etc. The big operation Lobby does not exist or don't have. Council became 24 that are in operation. Right now Utah Trust Fund, this is one of the topic UTNC should have been involved but they don't consider it. Utah Navajo, land bill, Shush Jaa' (Blue Mountain) and Cedar Mesa, the land there has a lot of laws, under Washington, liinaaloozi has been in operation. UTNC should have been involved but none.

Anything they do is for NN, I will represent NN and NN should do this, this should be for NN.

UT Navajo are the only group of people that have Water Settlement with the support of Utah government. We have accomplished so much with Water Settlement and UTNC don't want it or don't want to consider. Officials are doing well running the operation and working well. Do we need it?

I spoke with the Speaker, In Utah we are doing this and this is how they are in operation, and we don't have anyone to work with and nobody to speak for us. He said to put out a resolution UTNC to get some money aside and request for a consultant just dealing specifically with land, water and other issues that are needed and to work on it. So that's why I put this on the Agenda during Planning Meeting.

Another reason is UTNC are just dealing with what the Chapter Officials are already doing. It seems like they are both working on the same issues. They are not working for why they became a UTNC. Personally, he is a member of the UTNC, has not attended the meeting because he has too many things he is doing being a council, not able to make it to their meetings. Whatever we plan they are just against it. It does not look right; let's take a look at it again. Is it good or is the money being waste? **This resolution is requesting for re-evaluation.** When you go to Salt Lake, come face to face with the Angelo, they go against you; we are for NN is usually what they say. So it seems like we just work against each other, I am out there for you but when this happens I feel like I am working against each other. I don't know what you people think of yourself; this is what I think for you, if it does not happen, it might as well be, but it should be re-evaluated which would be better.

K. PEP (20 days)

Motion by Mrs. W. John, second by Lena begay with a vote of 28 in favor, 0 opposed, 4 abstained, motion carried.

IV. REPORTS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

A. "Youth Appreciation Day" Russell Gould, Public Relations Officers

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Russell Gould - Gave him the time to report to inform the community of the item A while we're waiting for a quorum at 11:45 a.m. Comes from Red Mesa community, was a chapter president there before. We selected a committee (naataanii shchiin) a while back for our youth. You all are aware that there is a horse race at Red Mesa/Teec area. We decided to have and include all the local area or chapters for this event. We inform all the local chapters and local community by way of flyers, poster, etc. Navajo Cortez is the place where we will have the event, area been used for pow-wow and other events in the prior years, the area belongs to Mr. Harry Warren and has a permit there. We are asking for donations from different entities with money, saddle, etc.

The four direction Trail Ride to start with on June 7, 2013. Registration starts at 6:00 and fun run starts at 7:00 a.m. from Red Mesa Chapter. The event will include field day and other activities. Poster are available for trail ride and given to community. We are all living within the same community, our children are all part of Red Mesa, Teec Nos Pos, Sweet Water, and Mexican Water, and we are going to have a lot of visitors from different areas.

We will have camp out and food available and that evening we will have Gourd dancing, etc. We need helpers there with cook and cleanup. On June 8th, Horse Race will take place right there within the vicinity, start from there and come back in around 12 miles. Cultural/traditional teaching of horses will be going on with different people from local area. The event is open for everybody and is our 1st Annual, we would like to see everybody there and encourage all your youth to participate (first 50 riders) will receive a T-shirt. Setting up a booth is ok as long as the people are benefiting from it. CHR booth will set up and others. Our event is co-sponsored with HIS Red Mesa Clinic and Utah Health System, Gym and facilities are provided by RMUSD. The organization's name "The Warren's racing".

Sam Woody elaborated on his trail ride from his home starting at 8:00 a.m. in the morning. The ride will include sight-seeing down through the Navajo Cortez Canyon onto the even site.

Jerry Tsosie – we will talk with the chapter manager and see if there is money since this is until June 7-8, 2013, we might find some funding.

B. Tommy Yazzie, RMUSD Superintendent

Introduced himself with a scenario of a teacher reading a book to the students, movie makers (main character) 2 things to report: John Wayne, Clint Eastwood, etc.

1) Current situation with R/M School District and most students go to Utah schools from here. Come fall report of 4 days school was put into place last year in spring). This is the only Chapter who requested for a report of how the progress/work is benefiting the student and staff, etc. We always plan and what the calendar will be like for next year, in a form of a survey.

What's the best feature of a 4 day week? Attendance is better for K-8th grade, doing better than 90%. The same thing with the staff – attendance improved and consistence with certified and classified. Did a survey for all four schools and they are doing better than 90%

For the month of April put all the date/report to Governing Board and they voted to continue with the 4 days calendar for next year. We also took a look at bus route, power, maintenance/operation, did we saved? Yes we did but have not calculated that yet. The only complaint from parents for we the little ones who get too tired from the long ride or they get hungry, not with the Junior High and High School.

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2) School finance Impact Aid from Washington and Arizona (for every dollar it's 50/50) is going to be there for one more year. We operate on about \$11,000,000 a year. Due to losing some students to Utah, we wondered about losing some money and we recommended to cut area where we don't need personnel, field trip, supplies, etc. but how do we make decisions, what criteria do we use to evaluate, NN said they can only maintained 15 miles of bus route, the board wanted to know what the student/teacher ratio was? M/O was adjusted, also a few cut with staff, K-8th -18/24 students per teacher. So base on this we cut some teachers, 170 students at Red Mesa and Red Valley is 71 students at high school. 17 – 18 students per classroom. Some of them were re-assigned to some other areas. Currently we are cutting the classified people, currently cutting 13 positions, waiting for the board meeting. One of the things the board don't want me to cut is classroom supplies/computers/books, classroom instruction and field trips.

High school graduation for Red Valley on the 17 and Red Mesa on the 18. It is always a joy for a student to finish their high school

Clean-up, lots of trash on the road/highway, etc., the school district did their share of cleanup. We still need to do Highway 160 to the state line. Beginning May 3rd Summer School will start.

Mary Benally- what about academic performance?

Superintendent – data (AIMS) has not been released until at a later date in July. We hope to see a similar date.

Lucy White – my kids like the 4 days, its working for us due to making appointment with dental, clinic, etc. Bus driver, went straight to school instead of stopping at MW store for restroom break.

Superintendent – a lot of field trip gets scheduled around May, it's the way they schedule their field trip, and the distance. Buses are waiting for them at certain area and they have to make it back in time. We need to re-evaluate the safety/condition of the field trip. Second part to this is we purchased five new buses and activity bus for comfort. The team goes long distance to play. Security was walking/driving around to all these activities, usually a lot of activities during this time in May. We usually have 8 securities on duty.

Woody Lee – ware/tear of buses, school has a lot to do with bus route road and allocation of money. Security – we try our best to do the right thing with our children, but for some reason our kids do something wrong, speed problem (security at the road) our kids get in trouble, etc. four days – Is there any reflection of the money?

Superintendent- transportation, according to mileage, field trip right after AIMS testing, bus comes in and while another bus is waiting, maybe that's why the driver is in a hurry and don't stop for restroom break, we can re-evaluate for safety and health condition and scheduling of field trip. Another is we purchased 5 new buses and activity bus in placed again. We will have 2 high school team. Security – walked around due to Prom going on and also a Men's League Basketball game going on. The demand on security, there are 8 security on campus/employed. Bottom line we need to re-evaluate all this.

C. Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency, Henry Haven (This is in regards to Tes Nez Iah Store) no show

D. Four Corners Regional Health Promotion Survey Report, EchoHawk Lefthand

(Overhead was used). Works with Health Promotion dept. we gave out survey about 2 months ago. CHIP health survey. So we can see what the problem is at hand with community. We gave the survey in all 4 community, Teec, M/W, S/W, and R/M, all four combined 468 people , 199 male, 267 female) Veronica Sagg tried to help with the survey. Flue Clinic at the school and see if there were any effects.

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80% at r/m and 30% elsewhere for clinic. The clinic hours were convenient for most of the people. The waiting time was efficient, but pharmacy waiting was too long. Confidentiality of visitation to the clinic was ok. Healing Method – traditional medicine/clinic. Community Unity – people helping one another (did not know what it meant)

Youth Opportunity, Roads – no change, worst, same. Environment – trash, no change. Community Wellness 32.9%. Resources for school is good 32.9%. Clinic is good. Individual is good. The survey was developed by CH people. Age Group 8-18 trash, drugs, stray animals. 19-39 unemployment/roads. 40-59 trash dumping, unemployment, roads, food. (garden) 60 –trash dumping, Come up with Health Coalition. Trash dumping solution, etc. We need to collaborate with the chapter. Meeting at the clinic on May 15 at 1:00 p.m. This Friday we have Walk for 21 miles at the clinic on May 10th.

David John – Chapter/Health to work together was discussed last month.

E. Malysa Egge – Bluff School – ASPIRE After School Program

Comes from South Dakota, 8 years here in Bluff area, been with Bluff School. Here on behalf of the students at Bluff with After School Program. A letter describing what they do supporting of the school, working with a small amount about \$30,000 provided by the state. We are required to seek a cash match, about \$3,000 for that reason I am here need your support. We have about 100 students at the school. About 58 have received our programs. Chapters who have students that are attending at the school. 19 students are enrolled with Mexican Water and grandparents also consider themselves as enrolled with the school. About 11 students who live within the boundary. The amount that can be provided if possible, we are looking for other resources. Requesting as much as possible (\$3,000.00).

Jerry Tsosie- will get together with chapter manager/senior accountant; find out how much we have if there is any. There are two people requesting for money from the chapter.

F. Betty Redmoustache – “MOLD” requesting for renovation (direct Darlene Yazzie (CHR) for re-assessment). Will base on Darlene’s assessment and there is about 4 or 5 other people who have the same situation.

G. Darlene Yazzie – Elder Fest, where will it be held M/W or S/W?” no show – food will be provided according to Jerry Tsosie, and also for Harry Descheny.

H. Harry Descheny – requesting for a meeting on May 15, 2013 (Soil/Water Conservation)

Donation of food for the meeting, needs a lot of support

I. Cassandra Beletso- UTNHS, Audit got a visit from the state and took a look at medication, hand sanitizer, how the tools are being washed/very good and there was not a lot of negative report of how the operation was going at the clinic. Some of containers were empty and these were in the negative report. They were told to put some hand sanitizer in hallways, etc. State of Utah is ok there is a way (resolution that is in placed) all community benefit from this.

Kenneth Maryboy – 600 million dollar that was stolen, that’s where the argument started, Donna Singer. The money belongs to the State and the governor does not want it don’t want to be the trustee. 638 is the best thing that could happen to us, it’s the people who are affiliated with it, that are the problem, and we have people who can be a part of the UNH who are qualified. But Mrs. Singer is there forever. Thanks Cassandra for sticking up for the UTNTF.

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Mary Benally – Wilfred Jones stated that Mossi Clinic is taking over Four corners Medical center. Is this right? Response still at discussion and will meet again this coming Sunday on the 12th

David John – Health Board/Window Rock is the chair. (**Grazing Rep. just arrived**) There was an incident at Sweet Water and was killed and taken to s/r, these same people called Shiprock HIS and threaten them and due to this there was a shot down and only come through front door. Parking is only in the front. Just for you to be aware.

Woody Lee – S/W people were in the wrong/coming from the clinic.
